

5 Common Questions New Believers Ask

"You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart." — Jeremiah 29:13

1. Is God real?

The order and complexity of the universe, the reality of moral conscience, and the historical evidence for Jesus' resurrection all point toward a real, personal God — see our Common Doubts videos for a deeper answer.

2. Why does God allow suffering?

Scripture teaches suffering entered through human rebellion (Genesis 3), not God's original design, and that God is working even hard things toward good for those who trust Him (Romans 8:28).

3. Can I trust the Bible?

The New Testament is backed by more manuscript evidence than any other ancient document, and its core claims were written and circulated within the lifetime of eyewitnesses.

4. What if I still have doubts?

Doubt is common, even among mature believers (see Mark 9:24). Bring your questions honestly to God and to others rather than suppressing them.

5. What if I mess up after becoming a Christian?

Salvation isn't based on your performance — it's based on Christ's finished work (Ephesians 2:8-9). Growth is a lifelong process, not instant perfection.
